An old, mad, blind, despised<sup>1</sup>, and dying  $king^2$ , – Princes, the dregs<sup>3</sup> of their dull race, who flow Through public scorn<sup>4</sup>, – mud from a muddy spring<sup>5</sup>, – Rulers who neither see, nor feel, nor know, But leech  $^6$ -like to their fainting country cling  $^7$ , Till they drop, blind in blood, without a blow, – A people starved and stabbed  $^8$  in the untilled  $^9$  field  $^{10}$ , -An army, which liberticide and prey Makes as a two-edg'd sword to all who wield<sup>11</sup>, -Golden and sanguine 12 laws which tempt 13 and slay 14; Religion Christless, Godless – a book sealed15; A Senate – Time's worst statute unrepealed 16, – Are graves<sup>17</sup>, from which a glorious Phantom may Burst, to illumine our tempestuous day.

## **GLOSSARY**

- 1. despised: hated
- 2. An old ... king: George III, who was blind and mentally ill. He died in 1820
- 3. dregs: the lowest forms of human life who deserve no respect
- 4. scorn: the feeling that someone is stupid or useless
- 5. mud ... spring: these people are corrupt (mud: wet, dirty earth) like their
- ancestors were (spring: a place where water comes up naturally from the ground). Lines 2 and 3 are also a reference to George III's disreputable son, who was Prince Regent from 1811 to 1820
- 6. leech: small soft creature that sucks blood from animals
- 7. cling: hold very tightly
- 8. stabbed: killed with a knife
- 9. untilled: not cultivated
- 10. A people ... field: this is a reference to the Peterloo

- Massacre in August 1819. when troops attacked peaceful protesters (▶ p. E107)
- 11.An army ... wield: the army is like a sword with two edges. With one it kills freedom (liberticide), while with the other it hunts down and kills (prey) people (wield: hold the sword)
- 12. sanguine: stained with blood
- 13. tempt: lead into temptation 14. slay: kill

- 15. Religion ... sealed: the state Protestant religion is all-powerful and intolerant
- 16. Time's ... unrepealed: the statute is the law which prevented Catholics and Dissenters from holding office (▶ p. E108) (unrepealed: not abolished)
- 17. graves: where people are buried when they
