Kohæsionsfejl

Kohæsionsfejl er når to sideordnede hovedsætninger er bundet sammen med blot et komma og uden et forbindelsesord eller tegnsætning til at adskille sætningerne. Den bedste måde at undgå sådanne fejl på er at sammenkoble sætninger ved at bruge en af disse regler: Brug et punktum, semikolon eller komma + FANBOYS (for and nor but or yet so).

konjunktion (FANBOYS: and, but, for, or, nor, so, yet, so)

Example: He enjoys walking through the country, and he often goes backpacking on his vacations

FORKERT They weren't dangerous criminals they were detectives in disguise.

RIGTIGT: They weren't dangerous criminals; they were detectives in disguise.

FORKERT: I didn't know which job I wanted I was too confused to decide.

RIGTIGT: I didn't know which job I wanted, and I was too confused to decide.

Sætningsfragmenter er ufuldstændige sætninger. Som regel er de sætningsdele, der er blevet adskilt fra deres hovedsætning. Ofte er det bare et punktum, der skal fjernes.

Nedenfor ses sætningsfragmenter markeret med rødt. Tegnsætning og andre ord, der skal tilføjes for at danne en helsætning er markeret med blåt.

 Fragment: Purdue offers many majors in engineering. Such as electrical, chemical, and industrial engineering.

Helsætning: Purdue offers many majors in engineering, such as electrical, chemical, and industrial engineering.

• **Fragment**: Coach Dietz exemplified this behavior by walking off the field in the middle of a game. **Leaving her team at a time when we needed her**.

Helsætning: Coach Dietz exemplified this behavior by walking off the field in the middle of a game, leaving her team at a time when we needed her.

 Fragment: I need to find a new roommate. Because the one I have now isn't working out too well.

Helsætning: I need to find a new roommate because the one I have now isn't working out too well.

• Fragment: The current city policy on housing is incomplete as it stands. Which is why we believe the proposed amendments should be passed.

Helsætning: **Because** the current city policy on housing is incomplete as it stands, we believe the proposed amendments should be passed.

Du har måske bemærket, at journalister ofte bruger et sætningsfragment eller en ledsætning som en separat sætning, når den følger klart fra den foregående hovedsætning, som i det sidste eksempel ovenfor. Dette bruges for at fremhæve ledsætningens indhold. I essays og andre mere formelle tekster bør du dog undgå sådanne fragmenterede sætninger.

Nogle fragmenter er ikke decideret stumper fra en helsætning, men er skrevet som en helsætning, der dog mangler subjekt og verballed.

Fragment: A story with deep thoughts and emotions.
