Act 1 Scene 1

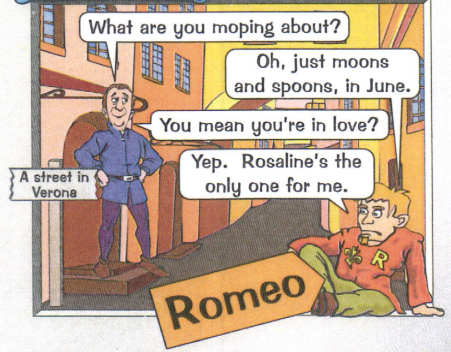


All right, calm down, calm down.

Act 1 Scene 1



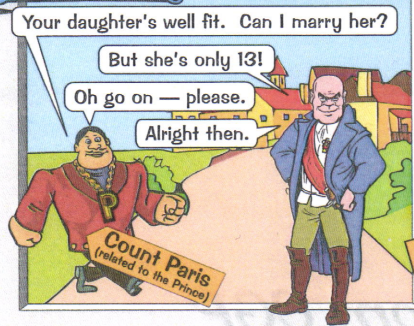
What are you moping about?

Act 1 Scene 2



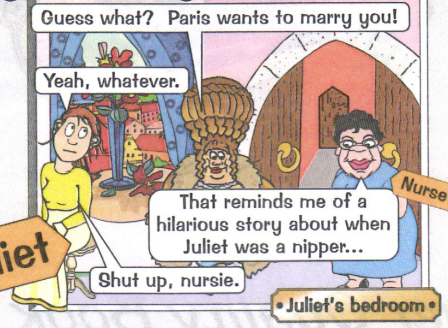
Your daughter's well fit. Can I marry her?

Act 1 Scene 3



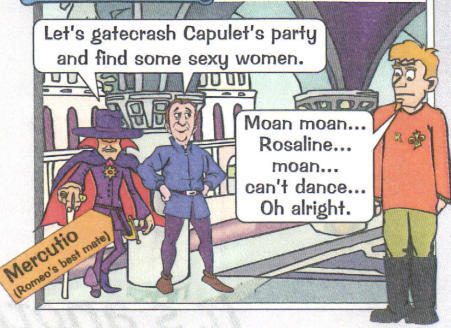
Guess what? Paris wants to marry you!

Shut up, nurse.

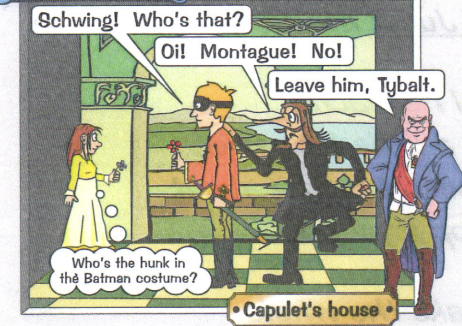
Act 1 Scene 4

Act 1 Scene 5



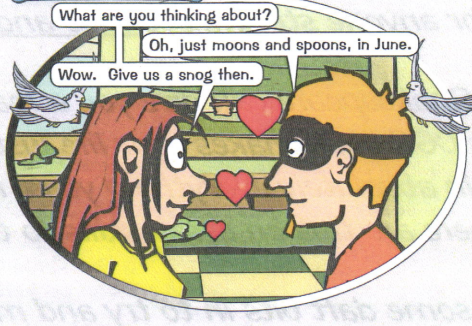
Schwing! Who's that?

Act 1 Scene 5

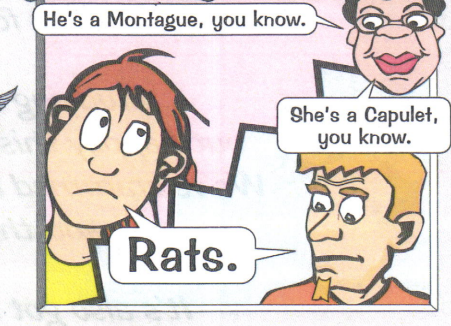


What are you thinking about?

Act 1 Scene 5

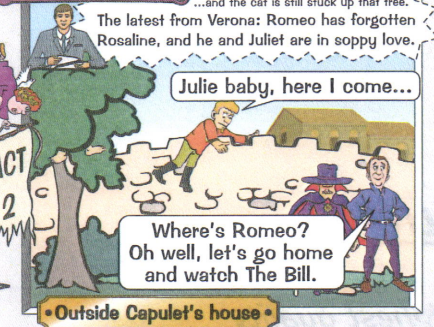


He's a Montague, you know.

Act 2 Scene 1

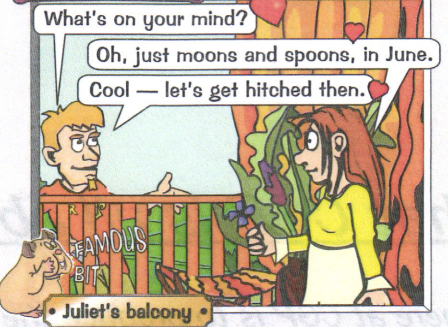


...and the cat is still stuck up that tree. The latest from Verona: Romeo has forgotten Rosaline, and he and Juliet are in sappy love.

Act 2 Scene 3



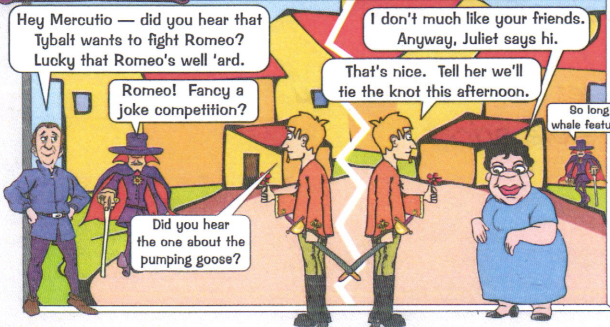
Keep up, Rosaline's old news. I'm madly in love with Juliet now. Will you marry us?

Romeo! Fancy a joke competition?

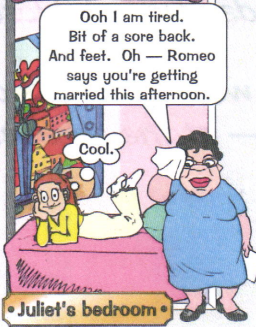
Did you hear the one about the pumping goose?

So long, whale features.

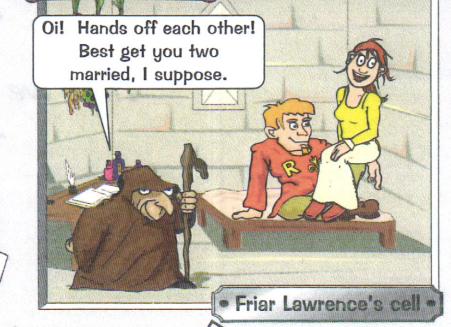
Act 2 Scene 5
